# A Short List of Things You Could Do with Custom GPTs

#### **Client Communications & Relations**

- Drafting project update emails for clients
- Summarizing meeting and creating action items
- Generating tailored responses to initial client inquiries
- Composing follow-up emails after client presentations
- Developing client-specific FAQs for each project

## Project Management

- Creating project timelines with key milestones
- Generating detailed task lists for team members/VAs
- Drafting weekly project status reports


# **Compiling Training Data**

Exercise 6: Turning Tasks Into Conversation Starters

#### **Examples of Conversation Starters**

- "Ask me questions one-by-one to guide me to a list of topics for my blog."
- "Draft an email introducing our architectural services and recent projects to a potential client."
- Write a polite follow-up email for a project proposal we submitted last week."
- "Draft an update email for a client on the status of their current project, including milestones reached and the next steps in the timeline."
- "Create a blog post about the latest trends in office building design. Keep it concise and highlight any innovations we've used in our recent projects."


## **Turn Tasks Into Conversation Starters**



Create a guide that reflects these preferences and provides a summary of my overall writing style

# Step 8: Testing & Refining Your Custom GPT

#### **Test & Refine**

Ask the GPT to create something (email, blog post, etc.) - Analyze the response.

- Is the GPT pulling from the training data?
- · Is the output structured correctly?
- What tweaks would you make to the output?

Adjust your GPT based on your responses or ask your GPT what it needs to make those tweaks.

## **TESTING & REFINEMENT:**

# Improving Your Custom GPT

Test analyze how your Custom GPT performs the task.

- Is the output what you expect?
- Is the GPT pulling from its training data?
- Is the output structured correctly?
- Refine & improve the configuration to get the results you want.

It's important to test & refine your Custom GPT.
